Highlights of the year 26th April 2021-to the 25th April 2022

The Financial Statement shows the Association in a healthy position going into 2022/2023. It reflects the ongoing work of the Committee throughout the year, despite the Covid 19 interruptions. We had a positive balance of over €11,900 at the end of the 2021/22 financial year compared with over €12,900 at the start of the year. This drop was primarily attributable to a large increase in expenditure compared with the previous 2020/2021. financial year when expenditure was artificially depressed due to Covid. Despite the large amount of activities since 25th April 2022 our bank balance remains strong at over €11,380 at end of October 2022.

With the facility of Zoom and the commitment of everybody on the Committee, it was a busy and productive year. **Publications**: There were 3 Old Tough Issues, 4,5,6 and Blue Cap.Vol.25.

The Association financed the printing of Blue Cap Vol. 23. Tom Burke's bumper edition"Reflections on 1918" While most members select the electronic form of publications, a certain number of printed copies are provided to those members who request it and for other purposes.

Trips

Durrow:-A very interesting members' day-trip to Durrow was held in September 2021 and was covered in *The Old Tough Issue 5*.

Salonika:-This trip was held in May 2022. The planning and organisation crossed 3 years with a postponement, due to Covid 19 restrictions, in 2021. An account of the trip is covered in *The Old Tough, Issue 7*. It is always our policy that trips should cover their costs as much as possible.

Due to Covid 19 there was no Christmas Dinner in 2021. However, a Special Christmas Service for our deceased members and their families was held in City Quay in November 2021.

The RDFA financed the publication of the Commemorative Booklet for this event held in October 2021. .
